"On Returning to Egypt"

Numbers 14:4 "So the people (of Israel) said to one another, 'Let us select a leader and return to Egypt.'"

It was during one of their many trips to the "whine cellar" that the liberated Israelites in the wilderness began yearning for the Bad Old Days in Egypt. In Numbers 13 spies are sent out to assess the Promised Land, and they return with good news and bad news.

Good news is that it really **IS** a "land flowing with milk and honey!" Bad news? There are "giants" guarding the land, and in their presence, "we were like grasshoppers." Thus the people began their lament and search for a leader who could take them backward to slavery.

It's really not unusual, is it? When greeted with news we don't want to hear; when faced with a fearful future; when confronted by uncertainty and odds that seem overwhelming; when in the presence of such "giants," the urge to retreat just seems, well, sensible. And there are plenty of leaders out there who are happy to take us back!

Fortunately, our Lenten Leader, the one who is always before us (not pulling us backward) knows something about wilderness wandering. From his encounter with Satan in the wilderness to his agony in Gethsemane's garden, Jesus fought the urge to return to the safety of a pleasant, safe past, so strong was his faith in his Father's plan and presence. "Nevertheless," he gasps as he twists in the dirt of the garden, facing "giants" that we cannot imagine. "Not my will but yours be done," he whispers.

It may sound like sad resignation, but in light of what will happen next, it's the commander's call to battle.

In such days as these, dear ones, we too might often share Israel's yearning to "select a leader and return to Egypt." In such moments, we might well remember that our Leader has selected us to follow him in confidence. In his presence, there are no "giants" to fear.

OPERATING FUND 2009 Year End Financial Summary

At December 31, our General Offerings were 3.0% below budget but 1.4% higher than 2008. Program Income & Designated Gifts were also below budget because several ministries/events did not occur in Outreach and Student Ministries as planned. Also, Mid-Week meals were not held during the spring because of construction.

Significant reductions in expenditures in Worship, Fellowship, Student Ministries, Outreach and Personnel helped offset the lower General Offerings. Property costs were lower because fewer mortgage payments were made than expected because of construction delays. Also, no additional custodial help was hired during 2009.

The actual deficit was \$22,870 less than originally budgeted. This deficit represents less than 1% of our total budget and 5.9% of our remaining Contingency Fund of \$242,000.
