MONTHLY CONNECTION

“The eyes of the Lord range throughout the whole earth to strengthen those whose hearts are fully committed to him.” 1 Chronicles 16:9

One of the priceless rewards of being in a family is watching toddlers, one by one, learn to take their first steps. Currently my granddaughter, Abby, is taking her first steps! Sometimes her strides are little, unsure shuffles. At other times they are giant stretches that usually end with a fall. Whatever the size, being right there with her is such a joy as we cheer her on.

When we are a part of a Christian congregation like Our Father Lutheran Church, we also instantly become part of a family – a church family! In this church family we together see precious children of God growing and developing in their walk with Christ. The challenge, though, lies in our ability to stop and notice this miracle unfold.

In his book, *Here and Now*, author Henri Nouwen says, “Ministry is, first of all, receiving God’s blessings from those to whom we minister. What is this blessing? It is a glimpse into the face of God. We can see God in the face of Jesus in all those who need our care.” During this month of July, as we begin our transition journey, Pastor Marty Teske and I will be seeing the face of Jesus as we begin meeting and coming to know you. It is my prayer that you look deeply into the eyes of your fellow members at Our Father and into our eyes. As you do so, it is my further prayer that you see Jesus, because Jesus is looking back at you through their eyes and through our eyes.

Is anyone in the Our Father family hurting? Then Jesus is hurting. The movie “Coach Carter” was the true story of Ken Carter. He was a successful sporting goods store owner, who in 1999 became the head basketball coach for a high school in impoverished Richmond, California. Dismayed by the attitude of his players and their dismal performance on the court, Carter set out to change both by imposing strict rules which demanded respectful behavior, dress code and good grades. One player named Timo quit the team, only to return later with the desire to be reinstated. He asked Coach Carter what he must do to play again. Carter informed him that he must complete 2,500 push-ups and 1,000 suicide drills by Friday – a task that even the coach thought impossible. By Friday, Timo was short of both goals. Although impressed by the effort, Carter asked him to leave the gym. Unexpectedly, another player, who previously had a personality conflict with Timo, stepped forward. “I’ll do push-ups for him,” he tells the coach. “You said we were a team. If one person struggles, we all struggle. If one person triumphs, we all triumph. Right?” Coach Carter was speechless but satisfied that his team was finally responding to his efforts, watched as his entire team one by one dropped to the floor and began doing push-ups to help Timo reach his goal.

Christ, risen and alive in our world and alive in us, not only won for us salvation and forgives our sins, he also has assembled us into a united and interdependent family – the church. The Apostle Paul reminds us in First Corinthians, chapter twelve, that when one part of this body suffers, every part suffers with it. And if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it.

As you move into these days of July and as our family “team” is beginning a journey of re-forming itself, look at each other through the eyes of Christ. Are there burdens that need to be carried? Are there individuals who are facing challenges? Are there parts that you can play in supporting and caring for someone else? Does someone need a listening ear? Certainly we pray for the Hinchey’s, who have taken their leave from us. And we, your Interim Pastors covet your prayers as we come among you. In these days I would also call upon you to encourage, support and pray for one another in new and special ways. Our journey on “paths not yet known” has begun, and we need one another in new ways! So may the Lord our God use us to build up, encourage, and strengthen His family.

(This total does not include an additional \$40,000 given for furnishings.) To put this achievement into perspective, the total is 96% of the amount originally pledged, and it is \$80,000 more than the Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF)—which financed our loan—predicted that we would receive. We know that in today's economy, many of you had to overcome significant challenges to complete your giving. We thank each and every donor for helping to make this possible! While this marks the official end of the capital campaign, you are still welcome to make additional gifts to complete a commitment or for further debt reduction. (Remember, every \$1 gift ultimately saves about \$2 in loan costs.) Please mark the "Debt Retirement" line on your envelope to denote such a gift.

As we have mentioned previously, we will now be compiling a book of all donors who have contributed to either *Growing Our Father's House* or *Furnishing Our Father's House*. 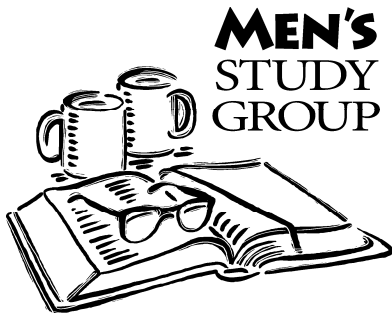


It's almost here!

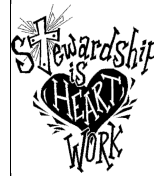

Transition Task Force Completes Its Work

With the congregation's vote on Sunday, June 27, to issue a non-tenured Call to Christa Stec as our new Music Director, the work of the Transition Task Force has been completed.

The Transition Task Force was formed in January, 2010 to prepare for the transitions inherent in the retirement of Pastor Hinchey and the departure of Music Director Margaret Hinchey. The Task Force addressed five areas: Retirement celebration events, retirement worship service, information services, Music Director hiring, and the calling of an Intentional Interim Pastor. The Transition Task Force held its final meeting on Monday, June 21. These are the people who offered servant leadership during this time of transition:

Christene Woodward and her vast committee worked to make the retirement celebration morning reception and evening dinner both lovely and truly classy affairs! Christene's committee also designed and distributed the beautiful invitations and arranged for very appropriate gifts for the Hinchey's.

Pastor Boos and his committee planned for the retirement worship service, a meaningful and poignant service that marked the beginning of a new life chapter for the congregation and the Hinchey's.

Tom Siegle gathered a team to keep the congregation informed in a timely way through print, interactive means, and the OFLC website. Our Father members always had an email address or a phone number to use to keep abreast of transition news.

Marv Oestmann and his Music Director Hiring Committee also worked long, hard hours to craft a job description and to select candidates for the Music Director position. With the committee's recommendation of Christa Stec at the Voters' Meeting on June 27, and the congregation's decision to issue a Call to Christa, they admirably fulfilled their charge.

Jack Weaver and Intentional Interim Pastor Call Committee had a formidable task: to search the nation for a Lutheran Intentional Interim Pastor who would meet the congregation's need for interim services following Pastor Hinchey's retirement. God blessed their work in providing Pastor Martin Teske as our Intentional Interim Pastor. He began his work among us on July 1.

The Steering Committee provided leadership to the Transition Task Force and supported and encouraged the committees in their work. Ruth Koch, Chair and Denny Harthun, former congregational president, Cathy Brondos, chair of the Personnel Committee, and Dave Rhode, current President of the congregation comprised this group. When Pastor Ransdell accepted a Call to Michigan in May, the Steering Committee was instrumental in bringing Pastor Tom Mroch's to the position of Interim Associate Pastor. Pastor Mroch began his full time work among us July 1.

Thank you for receiving the Transition Task Force's leadership during this time of transition and for participating so wholeheartedly in the work and events that marked this special time in our congregation.

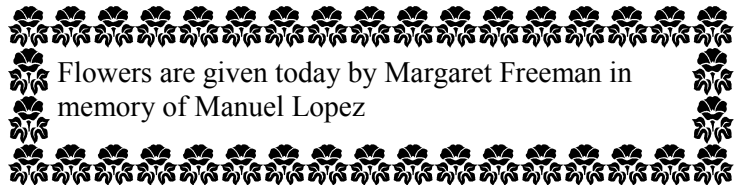
