## Voters' Assembly

Voters' Assembly Sunday, May 6, Noon

There are two items on the agenda for the upcoming Voters' Assembly: the approval of an update to our by-laws and a Divine Call for our new Director of Faith Development.

The Parish Council will recommend to the congregation an update to our by-laws that improves the way our church is governed. The current by-laws (**Article 5, "Voters' Assembly" and Article 10, "Purpose, Powers and Duties of the Parish Council"**) state that the congregation must approve changes to the policies that govern the work of the Parish Council.

The proposed update to these two by-laws removes this restriction and allows the Parish Council to make improvements to the policy document that guides its work **without the need to call voters' assemblies each time it is revised**. This living document will be reviewed at each meeting of the Parish Council to refresh the operation of the council and meet the needs of the congregation. The policies of the Parish Council are public documents and available upon request. Go to [oflc.net/administration](http://oflc.net/administration) to download a copy of the proposed language for Article 5, Article 10 and rationale for the change.

### Call Updates

Our Father is seeking candidates to fill two roles that will lead faith development and student ministries.

Director of Faith Development - Three strong candidates visited in April in advance of a congregational Voters' Assembly to extend a call on May 6th. Each candidate spent time with the call committee, staff and a group of leaders connected to the areas of responsibility for the DFD. The DFD is a reworked version of a previous position which provides leadership to our traditional discipleship vehicles that span from cradle to grave: Preschool, Children, Students and Adult Ministries.

Director of Student Life - Following visits from three candidates in March, the DSL call committee chose to renew its search for a new staff member to lead our ministry to middle and high school students. After gathering additional names, the committee reconvened in April and will soon begin a new round interviews. Student Ministry will be led over the summer by Mikaela Schmidt and Courtney Haag, who will work in part time roles under the supervision of Micah Steiner.

Please pray for discernment for our call committees, our candidates and their families.

**FINANCIAL SUMMARY  
THROUGH MARCH 31, 2018**

For first quarter, our General Offerings were 9% below budget by \$28,428 and by comparison in 2017 were \$13,036 or 3.9% below that year's budget. Monetarily, our first quarter 2018 is almost a mirror of 2017, less \$392 in 2018.

Expenditures are 5% below budget. Property costs lower due to loan reamortization and limited snow removal required this quarter. Additionally benevolence expenditures proportionally lower due to decreased first quarter offerings.

All other income and expense budget variances are in acceptable levels.

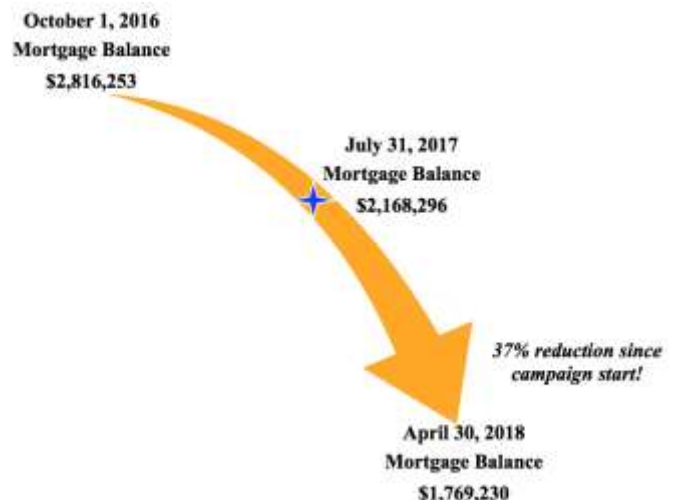

**Arise! Campaign  
Mortgage Reduction Progress**

April 30, 2018 marks the halfway point of our Arise! Campaign. The official campaign kicked off in October 2016 at which time our mortgage balance was \$2,816,253. By the grace of God, as of April 30, 2018 the mortgage has been reduced to \$1,769,230, a 37% reduction!

By eliminating our mortgage, we attain fiscal stability thereby moving us closer to attaining Our Father's vision of:

- 200 Individual Families on Mission
- 2,000 Members Experiencing Growth in Faith

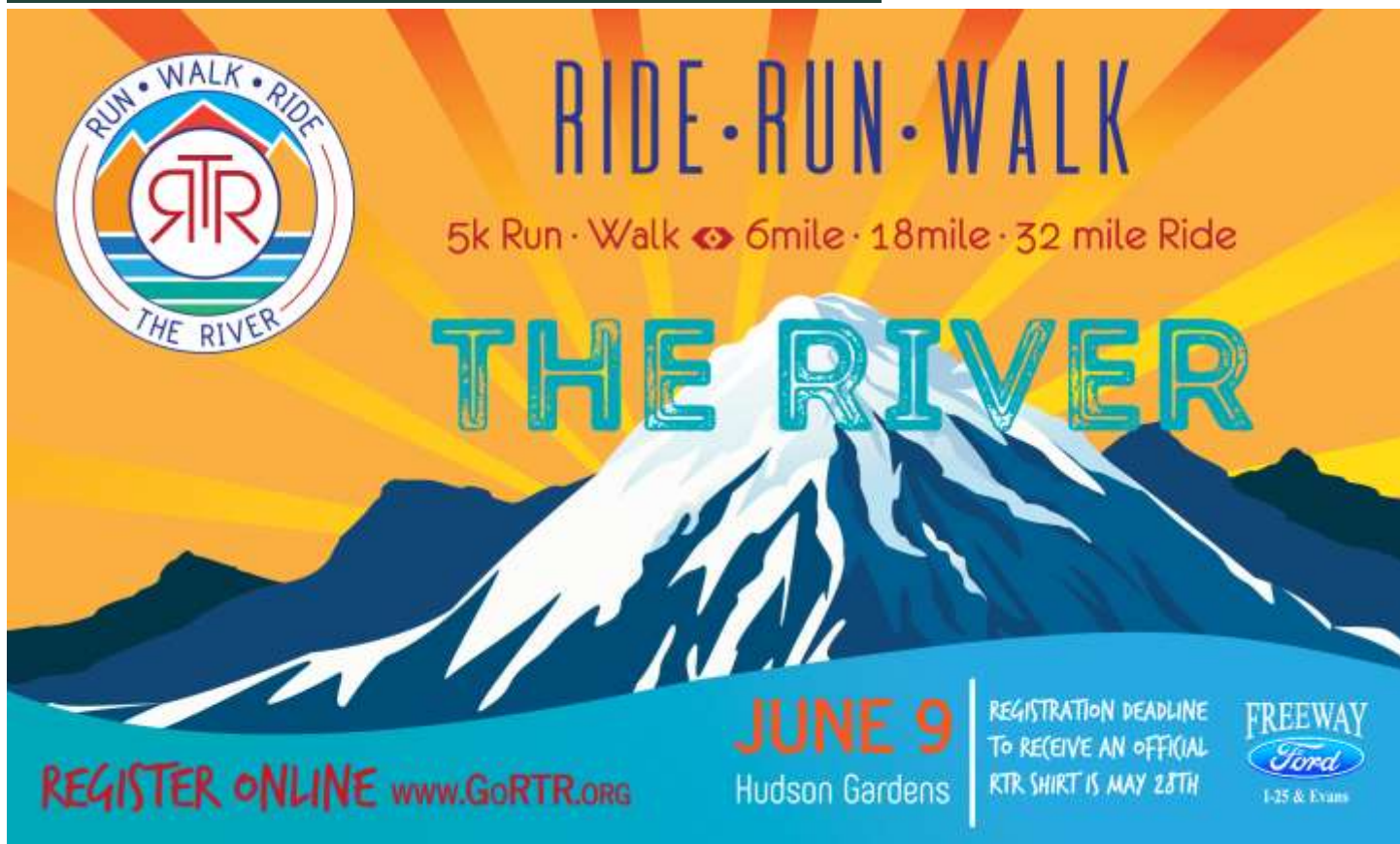
