Our Father Lutheran Church and the DFD

At Our Father, we have three strategic environments: we gather in worship, grow in faith, and live God's mission. I work with the "grow in faith" environment. The Director of Faith Development is a new position that leads a team overseeing educational ministries for all ages.

I organize adult Bible study, supervise student, children's, women's, and preschool ministries. I've spent my first three months getting to know you and our staff: Joey Schilling-Children's Ministry, Alison Cejka-Preschool Director, and Mikaela Schmidt-Middle School Coordinator, particularly. I've also spent time with the Director of Student Life call committee, searching for a candidate God is preparing.

I've started to lead children's messages. As the person responsible for the team of leaders who serve through our discipleship vehicles of birth through adulthood, it is important to get to know our children here. I plan to join some of our preschool parties, events, drop-off and pick-ups, and to get to know families through our outreach ministry. I've been able to drop in on Sprouts, lead teacher training, and meet Education, Preschool and Student Ministry Boards.

I enjoyed teaching the "Love Does" adult study during the first term of adult education. I'm eager to put together a menu of strong offerings in January, and examine the initial work done on our core curriculum in hopes of launching this venture fall 2019. I've missed teaching this term and am eager to teach again. Soon, I'm meeting with several people who have taught adult classes in the past (if you're interested in teaching, call me!)

In the absence of a Director of Student Life, I've also gotten to spend time with our high school students. I've enjoyed this for many reasons. This summer closed the door on twenty years of youth ministry for me. But also, your kids are fabulous, fun, amazing, and have spiritual depth. I've learned from them, been challenged by them, and grown in fellowship, spiritual maturity and biblical understanding with them. I love our mentors! The confirmation and high school mentors show a passion for the church matched by few. They are a group who obviously love God's church, and that is contagious and inspiring. I have seen our Confirmation Ministry, but haven't gotten to jump in, sit in, substitute or witness small group ministry yet. I'm eager for the day that a DSL can lead our high school and middle school and I can be present for parent and adult classes, confirmation and high school ministry on Wednesdays.

I'm just beginning work in women's ministry. The banquet and retreat committees are getting started, and MOPS is meeting regularly. A Mom's Night Out ministry has begun.

This is an exciting church, and an unbelievable opportunity in a position to serve this church. Thank you for calling me, and thank you for the grace of time to get to know you, and figure out ministry in this place. The Holy Spirit is active here, and I'm honored to jump into the work God has been doing here—it's a joy to be a part of it with you.

DSL Call Committee Update

In November of 2017, the congregation approved the adoption of a call committee to seek a candidate that might serve here as our full-time Director of Student Life, overseeing the MS and HS ministries at OFLC. During the months of January-March of 2018, the committee sorted through over 45 names that had been provided to us, and ultimately were led to bring 4 candidates for on-site interviews during the months of March-May. After these visits however, it was clear that one candidate was not a good fit for our congregation, and the 3 remaining candidates each felt God calling them into different ministry areas after their visits. We are also experiencing the reality of a shrinking pool of professional church workers known as DCE's, or Director of Christian Education. This is a struggle that many of our LCMS congregations are facing across the country.

Despite what appears to be "bad news" and might be frustrating to those waiting for God to provide a worker, I have full confidence that God is preparing our congregation, our students, and our community for a DCE that will be a perfect fit for our life here as *ordinary people knowing and sharing extraordinary life in Christ*.

In the meantime, the call committee has resumed our work of prayerfully discerning candidates for this position and conducting interviews. One candidate has made an onsite interview in October, and a second will be visiting in early November. I hope that you will join us in praying for God's will to be revealed, and for patience in waiting. Please also lift up our ministry team, support staff, mentors, and student ministry board who are collectively working hard to maintain our amazing ministry to students and parents without a full time DCE in place.
